

SEMI-ANNUAL FIRE SAFETY REVIEW

Your Firewise committee will be strolling through the community next week (wearing our dashing yellow vests!) as we assess potential wildfire hazards on each of the lots. Please remember, our CC&Rs specifically do not allow brush piles to remain on lots.

Fire Safety Alert

Fireworks are a common cause of wildfires in dry, grassy areas. Remember, fireworks are not allowed inside Kohala by the Sea. Stay alert on the Fourth of July weekend for airborne sparks from outside our community.

As a Firewise community, we are also committed to mitigating our risk by reducing highly flammable, non-native and invasive "fuels" such as buffel grass, fountain grass, kiawe (mesquite) trees and haole koa, particularly in gulches and near roadways. Keeping tree branches pruned to 8 feet above grass and away from roofs is also important, as are pruning dead palm fronds.

Are you new and not sure what haole koa looks like? (Hint: It's pictured on the right.) Or preparing a landscaping plan, and would like to know the most fire-resistant plants?
